DJEMBE can be used to control brown rust and yellow rust and reduce *Septoria tritici* and infection by ear diseases caused by *Fusarium, Cladosporium* and *Alternaria* species, with moderate control of powdery mildew. Through the reduction of ear blight, DJEMBE effectively reduces the level of the Fusarium mycotoxin deoxynivalenol (DON) in wheat grain. However, where Fusarium levels are high, the reduction achieved may not always be sufficient to ensure that DON levels fall below the statutory limit.
