- Terms of Reference included:
- To develop and agree a robust and harmonised pest management courses
- Other courses or documentation identified as relevant to pest management
- The courses developed should be applicable to the relevant end-users identified during its development and should be structured in an appropriate way.

Members of IPCA, NPTA & BPCA, IASIS & DAFM involved in the working group.

- Day 1 will include all the current CRRU Wildlife Aware course and can be standalone certified module.

- What will the new LANTRA course look like?
- Section 1 Unit 1 Rodent vertebrates (Biology & Behaviour)
- -Explain why the management of rodents is necessary
- Identify Rodent pests & distinguishing features
- Access the population size, extent & nature of pest activity
- Identify structural & environmental issues which contribute to pest activity
- Propose methods for management of rodent pests in accordance with CRRU Ireland pest practice requirements
- Describe the "risk hierarchy" for rodent management techniques
- Review & describe non-chemical methods for management of rodent pests
- Review & describe chemical methods for management of commensal rodents
- Explain the procedures appropriate for on-going monitoring of rodent activity
- Describe the Health & Safety requirements for rodent pest management activities
- -Explain the requirements for record keeping as required by CRRU Ireland

- What will the new LANTRA course look like?
- Section 1 Unit 1 Rodent vertebrates (Biology & Behaviour)
- Also explain the procedures appropriate for on going monitoring & control of rodent pest activity in sewers & drains
- –Section 1Unit 2 Other Vertebrates (Biology & Behaviour)
- Section 2 Invertebrates (Biology & Behaviour)
- Section 3 Management of pests
