## Information Note on the Use of Weed-wipers/Weed-lickers

## Background

Increasingly grassland farmers are using weed-wipers (weed lickers) to control weeds on their holdings, especially rushes. Before purchasing and/or using a weed-wiper on your holding, be sure you comply with the following requirements.

- You must be trained and registered with the DAFM as a Professional User in order to use these machines.
- Completion of an appropriate 'boom sprayer' course and subsequent registration with the DAFM will allow you to use a weed-wiper on your own holding, but not on any other holding.
- If you wish to offer a contracting service for weed-wiping, you must complete an appropriate specific weed-wiping course e.g., <u>Lantra Level 2 Award in the safe application of pesticide</u> <u>using vehicle mounted or trailed wick type applicators or City & Guilds PA1 + PA2F - mounted</u> <u>or trailed wick type applicator, or QQI Level 5 Mechanical Pesticide Application (5N20435).</u>
- Completion of a dedicated weed-wiping course will not qualify the candidate to use a boom sprayer.
- The only products approved for use in weed wipers are those based on the active substance glyphosate – check product labels for recommended methods of application and dilution rates. <u>Products based on the active substance MCPA are not approved for use in weed-</u> wipers and this method of use for MCPA based products is ILLEGAL.
- Only use the volume of product required to complete the weed-wiping task at hand.
- READ AND COMPLY WITH ALL PRODUCT LABEL INSTRUCTIONS
- Maintain accurate records of all pesticides applied on your holding, irrespective of the method of application.
